Common RV Grey/Black Water Tank Issues:

1. **Overflow.** These tanks all have sensors and a wire harness which are connected to the monitor panel inside the RV. The monitor panel reads the level of water inside the tank and is measured in thirds. Dirty tank probes cause false readings at the monitor panel. Keeping them clean is very important.
2. **Gray/Black tank odors:** Maintenance on these tanks requires the use of a tank deodorant and occasional cleaning. Add the proper amount of tank chemicals to your gray/black tanks before using and after dumping.
3. **On Full Hook Ups:** If you leave the termination valves open, when solids are flushed it allows the water to channel leaving the solids to stick to the bottom of the tank and build up. This leads to problems such as clogs, faulty reading of tank levels, and bad odors.

One common problem...tanks don't drain!

1. One common problem with RV Grey/Black water tanks is that they don't always drain completely. The black water tank holds waste flushed from the toilet as well as [in some cases] material from drains and sink traps.
2. While one common problem is tank overflow, another is the drain valve at the bottom of the tank. A clogged valve is caused by debris, such as toilet paper, feminine hygiene products and food scraps.
3. Flushing paper towels, dinner napkins, grease can quickly cause a blockage of an RV toilet / tank plumbing. Grease or vegetable oils will cover the sensors with sticky debris and allow for false readings.
4. When the sensors do not function properly, or the wastewater debris is not properly digested prior to flushing, the result can be foul odors and unnecessarily expensive RV plumbing service calls.

What's The Secret of RV Tank Flush?
